Ibn Sid: Isaac ibn Sid

Ibn Sid is believed to have played an important role in the observations and other research sponsored by $\underline{\mathbf{Alfonso}\ \mathbf{X}}$ of Castille, all of which bore fruit in the $\underline{\mathbf{Alfonsine}\ Tables}$. Some of his observations are mentioned by $\underline{\mathbf{Isaac}\ \mathbf{Israeli}}$, another Jewish astronomer from Toledo, who worked nearly a century after Ibn Sid. Otherwise, nothing is known about this figure.
